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## *A* bout the Community

Situated on Long Island's South Shore, Babylon is a community consisting of approximately 13,000 people. Thirty miles east of New York City, Babylon attracts residents who have the benefit of suburban living supplemented by the educational and cultural resources of the city.

## *A* bout the School District

The Babylon Union Free School District has three schools: one junior-senior high school, one grade school and one elementary school. The school year is divided into two semesters. A semester is 19 weeks, with 10-week reporting periods.

Babylon Junior-Senior High School is a nationally recognized school with a total enrollment of approximately 784 students in grades 7 through 12. Babylon students have received national, state and local recognition for academic, fine and performing arts, and athletic achievements.

# Graduation Requirements - Class of 2017

In order to receive a Babylon High School diploma, a student must meet the following requirements: obtain a passing score on the Regents exams in English, mathematics, global history and geography, U.S. history and government, and a laboratory science. The Advanced Regents diploma requires passing scores on three additional exams.

Our Regents diploma rate for the Class of 2016 was 95 percent. Of those diplomas, 32 percent of the class received the New York State Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation, 34 percent received the Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation with Honors, 29 percent received the Regents Diploma and 2.5 percent received a local diploma.

# The Babylon Junior-Senior High School Program

Accredited by the New York State Education Department

Babylon Junior-Senior High School is a college preparatory secondary school. The curriculum includes offerings in all major academic areas as well as business, art, music, theater, home and careers, and technology. A select number of students are offered accelerated courses in mathematics beginning in grade seven, and living environment and art beginning in grade eight. Dual credit

courses and Advanced Placement courses are offered in seven subject areas. This year, the high school program includes 11 AP courses in the areas of English, math, science, social studies and art. Due to enrollment, some AP courses are offered in an alternating year pattern. Fifteen college-level courses are offered in affiliation with SUNY Farmingdale, Syracuse University, Rochester

Institute of Technology, Long Island University and Suffolk County Community College.

The co-curricular program includes musical performing groups, theater, student publications, service and subject clubs, and athletic teams.

Accelerated grouping is offered in mathematics, English and science. The accelerated courses are followed by the letter X and are indicated on the transcript.

The Marking System: Students are graded quarterly and participate in Regents and/or final exams. Unweighted grades range from 0-100, with 65 as the passing grade.



## Transcript Information/Class Weight and Rank

Babylon High School computes weighted averages that reflect the degree of challenge of a student's program. It is recommended that students select the most rigorous and demanding courses available to them. The levels of classification are AP, College Level, Honors/Accelerated, Advanced and Regents. Courses are weighted as follows: Advanced Placement and College Level 1.10, Honors/Accelerated 1.05, and Advanced 1.025. Babylon Junior-Senior High School does not rank students. Postsecondary institutions and scholarship corporations that require specific information regarding rank in class will be provided with that upon request.
